

Shell Counting Activities

You will need:

A large container filled with sand, a bucket and spade, shell pattern card downloaded from the website.

Talk to the children about the different patterns and designs of shells as they play. Discuss, shapes, lines, patterns and colours with good adjectives to describe the shells such as fat, white, thin, sleek, rounded, rough, smooth, inside, outside.

Each child digs out a shell.

How many shells have I 'dug up'? Place each shell on the shell pattern card following the count sequence. The final number reached indicates how many shells 'found'.

Find the Numicon shape that matches the number of shells found. Can you find the shape on the number line?

You might want to record on a sheet how many shells are found.

Who has the most shells? How many more? How many less?

How about digging for the Numicon shapes? Pegs?- then put them into the Numicon pattern to find out 'how many?'

Enjoy songs, poems and stories with shells. This one was a favourite years ago sung by Elvis Presley:

Pearly Shells, from the ocean Shining in the sand Covering the shore When I see them My heart tells me that I love you More than all those little pearly shells!

Other activities with shells: Make necklaces together! Visit the museum to see their shell collections or suggest to families for a weekend activity.
